

## **Economic & Food Security Impacts**

20,000 small farms, ranches, and families in Washington raising livestock for meat depend on these processors

Meat producers and processors are often rural, underserved, in high poverty communities, and cornerstones of their local economies

### **Climate Impacts**

Offal can be methanogenic,
but is also:
A sought after cultural food
Highly nutrient dense
An important feedstock for rendered products &compost

### **A Sizeable Impact Opportunity**

~150 small processors
70 % of processors are landfilling

Avg. 6,000lbs of waste produced per week

>50% have experienced recent limitations

# New Market Development

Human food, pet food, hides, fertilizers.



### Rendering

Ensuring access and fair competition.



## Composting\*

Commercial, Municipal, On-site options.



## **Biodigestion**

Aerobic & Anaerobic options.

## Input straight from processors:

- Solutions MUST be economically viable
- Staffing new enterprises is hard in an already labor challenged industry
- Hands-on, personalized technical assistance is crucial for start up and troubleshooting
- The need is NOW many processors are one landfill or hauler or transfer station call away from shutting down

- Lack of renderers that match their scale
- Examples of meat processors rejected at the landfill gate, citing organics management goals
- Lack of space and/or knowledge about how to properly manage onsite composting at their facilities
- Partnership with DOT Roadkill Composting Facilities? Lack of resources an issue.
